NAU is working in a consortium with rural Yuma area LEA's (Yuma Elementary, Yuma Union High School District, Crane, Somerton, Gadsden, Wellton, Antelope, Dateland, Mohawk Valley, Quartzite and Parker school districts). All of these rural districts enroll high numbers of ELL students.

<u>Objectives of the Program</u>: In PRIME cohort 2, 16 paraprofessionals will complete a 71 credit hour program during five semesters, resulting in completion of all coursework for a Bachelors Degree with a Dual Major in Elementary and Special Education and ESL endorsement. The PRISE grant pays tuition for the five semesters of coursework, books and professional conference attendance. **NOTE: Students are responsible for paying for the sixth semester, the student teaching semester.**

Application for PRIME Program must include:

- 1) <u>Unofficial Transcripts</u> showing ALL college coursework including proficiency in Spanish as demonstrated by a proficiency exam (CLEP) or two semesters of conversational level Spanish. All applicants must show AGEC stamp or prove successful completion of all NAU Liberal Studies requirements.
- 2) Curriculum check sheet completed and approved by Nancy Blitz
- 3) Letter verifying employment by Fall 2013 as a paraprofessional (cross categorical, ELL or elementary ed.) in one of the PRIME consortium districts listed above. (May be attained at a later date)
- 4) 2 recommendation forms sent by reference persons to Dr. Patricia Peterson c/o to Elizabeth Ketterer (928-523-0677) by fax 928-523-1929 Attn: Elizabeth Ketterer ASAP
- 5) Completed PRIME application and essay
- 6) Proof of NAU Undergraduate Admission or verification of submission of application
- 7) Arizona IVP Fingerprint clearance card or a copy of the application for the card.
- 8) Applicants selected for the potential scholarships must meet with Nancy Blitz to finalize the admission process and for information regarding Teacher Education Program admission.
