# ITEP – Tribal Climate Change Program



**The Institute for Tribal Environmental Professionals** (ITEP) established its Climate Change Program in 2009 to provide support and be responsive to the needs of tribes that are preparing for and currently contending with climate change impacts. The development of the program has been guided by a steering committee that includes tribal environmental and natural resource professionals who are actively working on climate change issues.

The Climate Change Program offers training, technical assistance, informational resources, and tools to build capacity of tribes to address climate change impacts. These include Climate Change Adaptation Planning courses for tribal environmental and natural resources professionals, Tribal Climate Change Webinars, the Tribes & Climate Change website, and the monthly Tribal Climate Change Newsletter. ITEP conducts outreach with tribes, federal agencies and other entities, and is developing collaborations to provide further training opportunities and assistance to tribes on climate change issues.

#### **Tribal Climate Change Training Courses**

ITEP offers training to tribal environmental and natural resources professionals to build their capacity to address climate change issues.
