
We are administering a \$1.9M grant from the Department of Energy with our Native-to-Native Energy Sovereignty grant

The Oglala Lakota have an average per capita income of ~\$20k per household Why is that...? Lack of economic opportunity = diminished hope

Unemployment hovers at approximately 75% - 85%.

The four biggest employers on the reservation are: the Oglala Sioux Tribe (OST), K-12 schools, Indian Health Service(IHS), and the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA).

If you're not working for one of these entities, you're likely *unemployed*.





Red Cloud Renewable has the only fully functional renewable energy training center (RCREC) on a reservation.

We are providing a pathway for Native Americans to join the solar workforce for tomorrow's energy future.

- Our place-based initiatives go beyond traditional workforce development because we are acutely aware of needed foundational changes in the way things are done
