

NTWC's Webinar on the 2023 Final CWA Section 401 Water Quality Certification Improvement Rule

On February 20, 2024, the National Tribal Water Council held a webinar on the EPA's 2023 Final Clean Water Act Section 401 Water Quality Certification Improvement Rule. The final rule supports a timely and predictable water quality certification process under CWA Section 401. The final rule became effective on November 27, 2023.

The goal of the webinar was to assist Tribal Nations in understanding the options that may work best for them under the final rule and the necessary elements needed for implementation of these options. By providing Tribal Nations with the understanding of the Section 401 certification pathways, tribes can decide for themselves on how best to protect their water quality and assert their water quality-related goals and values. In this revised rule, eligible tribal nations can obtain treatment in a similar manner as a state (TAS) solely for Section 401 as a certifying authority or as a neighboring jurisdiction under Section 401 (a)(2) without first applying for TAS for water quality standards under CWA Section 303 (c).

The webinar was moderated by NTWC Chairman Ken Norton, of the Hoopa Valley Tribe, and the distinguished panelists were Jill Grant, Jill Grant & Associates; Law Professor James Grijalva, University of North Dakota; and NTWC Region 5 Representative Nancy Schuldt, Fond du Lac Band of Lake Superior Chippewa.

NTWC Chairman Norton provided a brief background and overview of the final rule. Jill Grant provided a legal review of the 401 certification requirements for administering and implementing TAS options. Professor Grijalva discussed the importance of water quality requirements in Section 401 and its application under TAS options for Section 401(a)(1) and 401(a)(2).

Lastly, Nancy Schuldt shared past and present experiences of EPA exercising its oversight duties for determining whether an upstream discharge "may affect" the

TRIBAL CONSULTATION OPPORTUNITIES

EPA's Proposed Rulemaking for Incorporating PFAS Reporting Requirements into NPDES Application Forms

Deadline: April 1, 2024

EPA is initiating consultation and coordination with federally recognized Indian Tribes on a forthcoming proposed rulemaking that seeks to update requirements for several of the existing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit applications to address monitoring and/or reporting of Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS). This rulemaking will consider adding Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances reporting requirements to permit applications for new and existing publicly owned treatment works, new and existing manufacturing, commercial, mining, and silvicultural operations, and stormwater discharges associated with industrial activity.

The deadline to submit a comment is April 1, 2024. Tribal governments may request one-on-one consultation meetings with the EPA. EPA's Approach to Improving Performance Reporting in Agency Grant Programs Deadline: April 12, 2024

EPA's Office of the Chief Financial Officer (OCFO) invites federally recognized Indian Tribes to provide input on the agency's ideas for improving performance reporting in its grant programs.

The agency has the opportunity to develop a performance reporting framework that articulates common post -award performance elements across grant programs, in order to clarify expectations, reduce reporting burden for grantees, and improve the quality of performance information that is collected across the EPA. The agency is developing guidance to define and explain different components of performance reporting that may be used by grant programs that do not have a performance reporting framework in place.

EPA's Sixth Proposed Unregulated Contaminant Monitoring Rule (UCMR 6) for Public Water Systems

Deadline: June 20, 2024

EPA is initiating consultation and coordination with federally recognized Indian Tribes on the development of the sixth Unregulated Contaminant Monitoring Rule (UCMR) for public drinking water systems. Under the UCMR, EPA collects data for contaminants suspected to be found in drinking water, but that do not have health-based standards set under the Safe Drinking Water Act.

EPA will be holding upcoming webinars to describe potential approaches for developing UCMR 6, which includes prospective drinking water analytical methods and contaminants, possible sampling design, and other monitoring considerations.
