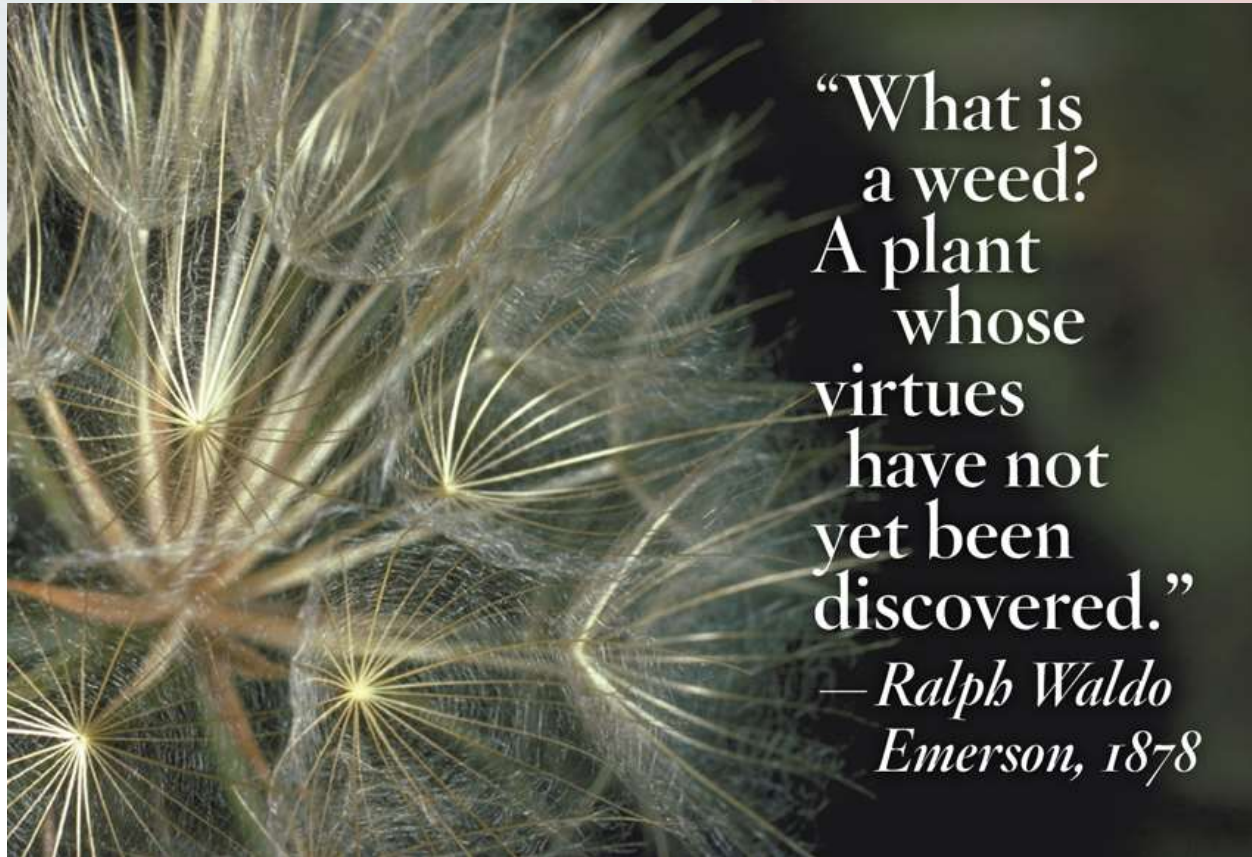

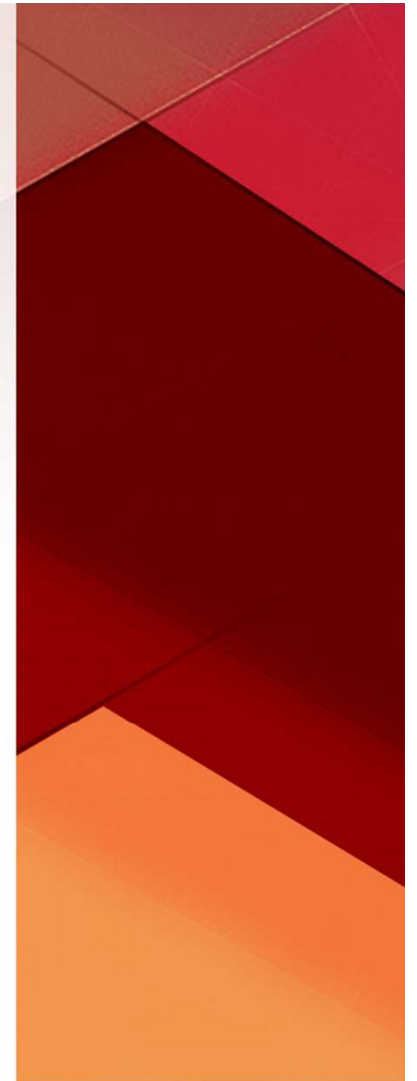
- One man's trash is another man's treasure

1. Rethink 

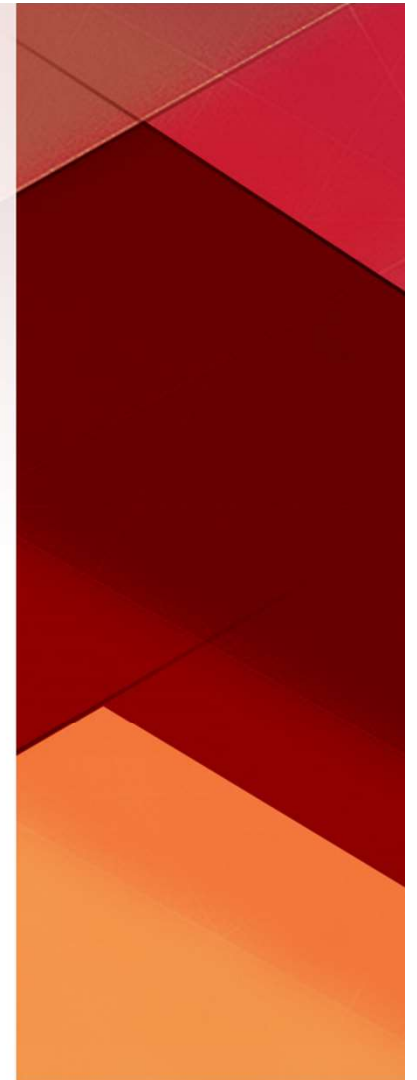
2. Refuse

Creating Treasure from Trash

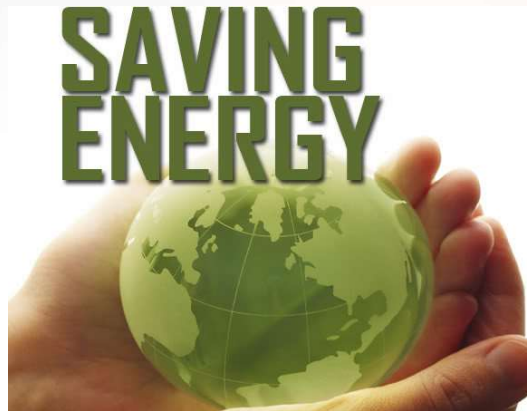


- Creative, resourceful and innovative
- Key question- “What can I make out of this?”
- Things to think about:
 - Does an object’s shape remind you of something? Turn it upside down- Does it look different?
 - What if you covered it up with paper or cloth? Painted it?



- Can you put anything in it? On top, under, or through it?
- Can you hang it up or hang something from it?
- Does it come apart? Use separate parts?
- Jewelry? Clothing?

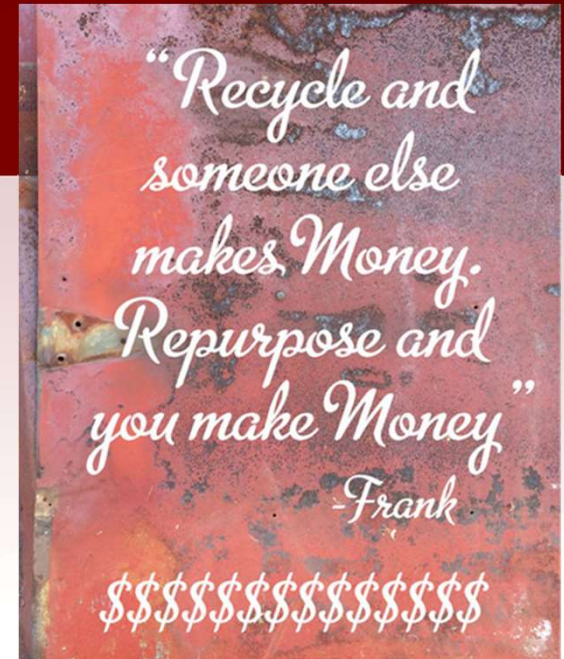

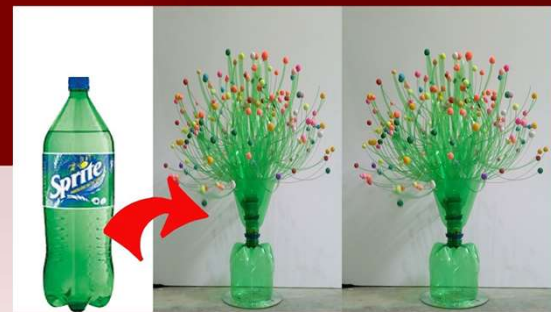

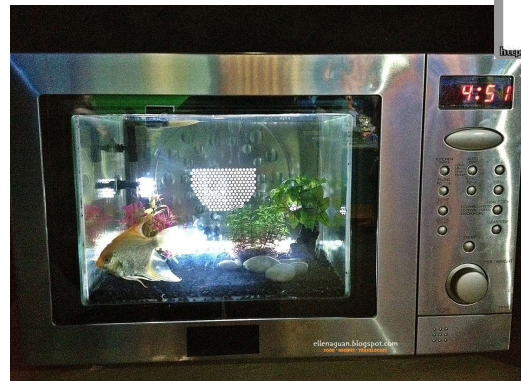
