The Bidding Process



- May get at least 3 bids, but may justify sole sourcing
- Developed inventory form and training survey and distributed to tribes
- Gave contractors estimate of materials currently stored at transfer stations and number of tribal employees in need of training









Training

- ▶ 40 Hour HAZWOPER 26 signed up, 21 attended
- ▶ 8 Hour Refresher 18 signed up, 9 served
- Participation from 10 tribes



- Not everyone was able to participate, may be able to reimburse for training expenses
- ▶ Total cost: \$7,270






- Automotive Fluids: 390 gal
- ► Fluorescent Bulbs: 420
- Car Batteries: 15
- Acids, bases, and caustic: 1,152 lbs
- ► Flammable & toxic: 1,091 lbs


